#### DON'T FORGET....

Please check your parent PowerSchool account to keep up to date with your child's fees. If you have not done so, please pay your school fees as soon as possible. #### ABSENCES AND VACATIONS

For your child's safety, we ask that you please contact our school office by phone at 780-437-6022 every time your child will be absent from school. It is vital that we know that your child is safe during school hours. This includes absences for appointments, vacations, and illness. During the hours that the school is closed, you may always leave a message on the school's voicemail system.

#### KINDERGARTEN REGISTRATION

If your child will be **five years old by December 31st, 2023**, they are eligible to attend kindergarten in the 2023-2024 school year. Edmonton Catholic Schools Division (ECSD) only offers online registration. Go to the online form, located at <a href="www.ecsd.net">www.ecsd.net</a> create an account, and then fill out all the necessary information. Kindergarten registration began online on January 23<sup>rd</sup>, 2023. We will continue to accept school registrations for kindergarten after this date and throughout the rest of the school year, but you may be waitlisted.

#### To register your child for kindergarten you must have:

- Completed Registration Form (online)
- Copy of your child's Birth Certificate (uploaded online)
- Copy of the child's/parent's Baptismal Certificate (uploaded online)
- Proof of Residency (Proof that you live in our catchment area)

Confirmation of Registration will NOT occur until we have ALL the required documents.

#### LAST DAY TO REGISTER FOR RETURNING STUDENTS

Pre-enrolment for students already attending an ECSD school began on **Monday, January 23.** You will be able to log onto the PowerSchool parent portal and select your preferred school for the 2023-2024 school year using the "Intentions for Next Year" icon. All students currently in school will need to declare their intentions regardless if they are staying with their current school or transitioning into kindergarten, or another school. This pre-enrolment process for returning students will close on **Friday, March 10**<sup>th</sup> to allow our schools time to plan for staffing, class sizes, and programming for the new school year. If your plans change after **March 10th**, you can always contact the school to change your school selection. The pre-enrolment process for returning students is key in helping us understand how many students to expect at our school for September 2023.

#### INTERNATIONAL WOMEN'S DAY


#### MONDAY, MARCH 8TH



### Let Your Light Shine Forth

#### March 2023

During this liturgical season, the Lord takes us with him to a place apart. While our ordinary commitments compel us to remain in our usual places and our often repetitive and sometimes boring routines, during Lent we are invited to ascend "a high mountain" in the company of Jesus and to live a particular experience of spiritual discipline – ascesis – as God's holy people. (Message of His Holiness Pope Francis for Lent 2023)

In his message for Lent this year, Pope Francis reflects on the learning that flows from the Gospels' accounts of the Transfiguration. Jesus takes three of the disciples up the mountain so that together, they may have a grace filled experience after a disciplined journey. He asks us to draw parallels between the spiritual journey of Lent and the ongoing synodal journey that the Church has undertaken. He reminds us that the purpose of our Lenten and corresponding synodal journeys is to "enter ever more deeply and fully into the mystery of Christ the Saviour."

This has been a year of unprecedented growth for our Division. Since September 1, 2022, we have grown by an additional 1,667 students. We have welcomed over 790 students from Ukraine and an additional 628 students from other countries. We already have 1,673 kindergarten students who have applied for the upcoming school year and it is growing everyday! We are pleased and honoured that our families are seeking an excellent, faith-based Catholic education for their children! Growing enrolments mean that our Division also needs more schools to address our needs. Please watch our March 22 Public Board Meeting to learn about our Capital Plan requests that will be submitted to the Government of Alberta. You can find connection information on ecsd.net.

We are excited to announce the names of our two new schools! On February 22, the Board of Trustees voted to name the new Catholic High School in Dunluce/Castle Downs Blessed Carlo Acutis Catholic High School. The new Catholic K-9 school in Lewis Farms/Secord will be called St. Josephine Bakhita Catholic Elementary/Junior High School. These two extraordinary namesakes will provide exemplary models of faith in action for the families and staff who join those communities.



#### **Three-Part Recipe for Lent**

We have started our Lenten journey towards the Feast of all Feast Days – The Resurrection of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ. During these 40 days of Lent the Church calls us to prayer, fasting and almsgiving – a three–part recipe for Lent. During these 40 days of Lent let our prayer be the prayer of the tax collector in the Gospel of Luke: "God, have mercy on me, a sinner" (Lk. 18:13). The tax collector, standing alone in the temple, did not dare to lift up his eyes to heaven. He was too full of shame. He looked nowhere but to God's mercy for help. His only plea is, "God, have mercy on me." Let this be our plea as well. And the miracle in all of this is that there is mercy.

At the very heart of the universe beats God's love. This is why we pray, "Lord, have mercy." This prayer, uttered with the least particle of faith, will move mountains and open the way for God's forgiveness and for the coming of His kingdom in our hearts.

The second part of the recipe for Lent consists of fasting: "When you fast, put oil on your head and wash your face, so that your fasting may be seen not by others but by your Father who is in secret; and your Father who is in secret will reward you" (Mt. 6: 17-18).

We fast for many reasons but the main reason for fasting during the Lenten season needs to be love. Love was one of the main purposes for fasting in the early Church. An ancient Christian writer, Hermas, in the 2<sup>nd</sup> century wrote about an interview with an angel on the subject of fasting. When asked about what kind of fast he was making, Hermas replied that he was fasting in the usual manner. The angel was not impressed with Hermas and told him that his fasting was useless. "If your fasting is to have meaning," said the angel, "one should keep careful track of how much money is saved by it and then given to the poor and the needy." This is the fast that the Church calls us to practice during Lent. We are called to fast not only for reasons of self-control and prayer, but also for reasons of love: to deny ourselves something in order to share it with a person in need.

After prayer and fasting the third part of the recipe for Lent is expressed in Christ's words: "Whenever you give alms, do not sound a trumpet before you, as the hypocrites do in the synagogues and in the streets, so that they may be praised by others. Truly I tell you, they have received their reward. But when you give alms, do not let your left hand know what your right hand is doing, so that your alms may be done in secret: and your Father who sees in secret will reward you" (Mt. 6: 2-4).

The Church always encourages us to take care of the poor, the widow and the orphan. To answer that call we need to be reminded of the following passage: "Truly I tell you, just as you did it to one of the least of these who are members of my family, you did it to me" (Mt. 25:40). Jesus shows us that he is present in all persons. This does not mean that God and his creatures are identical by nature but by grace as members of his body. This is the mystery of the visible presence of Christ among us today. So whenever you give alms to the poor and needy, do it in secret and your Father will reward you.

This is then the three-part recipe for Lent that the Church offers us. Why not try it. You will find it to be the perfect recipe if you are looking not only for a resurrected Christ but also for a resurrected you this Easter.
