

Dear brothers and sisters, it is my hope that our meetings in these days will point out new paths to be pursued together, instil courage and strength, and lead to greater commitment on the local level. Any truly effective process of healing requires concrete actions. In a fraternal spirit, I encourage the Bishops and the Catholic community to continue taking steps towards the transparent search for truth and to foster healing and reconciliation.

(Pope Francis, Address: Meeting With Representatives of Indigenous Peoples of Canada, 01/04/2022)

The month of June is National Indigenous History Month, so it is very timely for us to consider the historic meeting at the beginning of April between our Holy Father and a delegation of Indigenous Peoples from Canada, and the subsequent apology for the Church's role in the tragedy of Residential Schools. The eyes of the world were turned to the Vatican in hopes of a formal apology. Pope Francis shared his indignation and shame and committed to coming to Canada to meet with Indigenous Peoples to better express his closeness. We now eagerly await his visit this summer from July 24-29. You can visit www.papalvisit.ca to learn more about the visit and to sign up for a newsletter to keep you informed.

Students, staff, and families can visit <a href="www.ecsd.net">www.ecsd.net</a> to explore our National Indigenous History Month webpage. One of the resources available is a virtual calendar that will reveal a new video each school day leading up to National Indigenous Peoples' Day on Tuesday, June 21. The videos will share information about Indigenous history, languages, cultures, and experiences.

At the May 25 Public Meeting, our Board of Trustees passed the 2022-2023 Division Budget. Highlights include the Division continuing to fund schools on enrolment and provide additional funding allocations for schools based on the assessed needs of students in the classroom, no increases in bus pass fees, a request to Alberta Education to use \$21 million from our Accumulated Surplus from Operations (ASO) to finance a much needed K-9 replacement school in northeast Edmonton, and a further request to use \$5.8 million ASO to address resources being directed towards the new curriculum implementation, staffing cost grid movement, as well as increases in staff benefit rates. The Board of Trustees also received the report on the comprehensive, 18-month study of its School Resource Officer Program. More than 5,500 students, 736 parents, and 617 staff from schools where SROs were present offered their opinions on and experiences of the SRO program through an online survey. As well, focus groups with students and parents from diverse backgrounds and staff were conducted, as were interviews with school administrators, Division leaders, and Edmonton Police Service SROs and leaders. The study identified several strengths and clear areas for growth in the delivery of services of the SRO program. Edmonton Catholic Schools and Edmonton Police Service will now take those recommendations and collaborate on improving the SRO program. June also brings us Father's Day. In his Sunday Angelus on March 27, 2022, Our Holy Father, Pope Francis, was reflecting on the Parable of the Prodigal Son. He spoke of the father's response to the indignant son who had stayed at home: "'Son, you are always with me, and all that is mine is yours' (v. 31). He tries to make him understand that for him, every child is all of his life. Parents know this well and are very close to feeling like God does." I wish a very Happy Father's Day to all those who lovingly dedicate their lives to loving and caring for our precious children, always and through all things!



It is staggering to realize that this is the last newsletter of the 2021-2022 school year! Time flies in the best possible way when you are focused on the mental, physical, and spiritual growth and development of our students. I am so proud of all that our staff has accomplished in Jesus' name with your children. I wish you all a rejuvenating and restful summer, full of endless moments encountering the glory of God.

I leave you with an excerpt from "At the End of the Year," by John O'Donohue:

As this year draws to its end,
We give thanks for the gifts it brought
And how they became inlaid within
Where neither time nor tide can touch them.

The days when the veil lifted And the soul could see delight; When a quiver caressed the heart In the sheer exuberance of being here.

We bless this year for all we learned, For all we loved and lost And for the quiet way it brought us Nearer to our invisible destination.

### Peace be with you

Pope John XXIII wrote perhaps the most famous of all peace encyclicals, "Pacem in Terris". He said that there can be no peace among men unless there is peace in each one of them.

True peace will come about only if it is based on justice and depends upon nations and peoples mutually accepting the moral law. True peace must be built upon the Ten Commandments. It must link the peoples of different countries in a bond of Christian charity.

Peace must spring from our hearts. It must embrace a love of God and a love of neighbour. Peace will reign among us all if we possess peace within our souls. We are at peace with ourselves if God's grace and God's friendship reside within us.

Think of the angels on the night of Christ's birth, hovering above the stable, singing "Glory to God in the highest and peace on earth to men of good will."

St. Francis of Assisi was a man of peace who composed prayers which he said frequently, inspiring our modern prayer that bears his name: "Lord, make me an instrument of your peace."

"Lord, make me an instrument of your peace. Where there is hatred, let me sow love."

It ends:

"It is in pardoning that we are pardoned, It is dying that we are born to eternal life."

Let us accept the peace of Christ in each of our souls and convey it to others so that we may bring peace to this world.

### **CATHOLIC EDUCATION - Did you know?**

There are 5 Precepts of the Catholic Church. These Precepts are responsibilities we accept and support as faithful Catholics, one of which is to support the various needs of the Church. Catholic Education and its support would come under this particular Precept. Consequently, parents of school aged children should understand that if possible they ought to send their children to a Catholic School. Why? To send your child to a Catholic School is one way to assist in his or her moral and spiritual formation as well as academic instruction. A Catholic Education complements the excellent beginning parents provide in the home as well as through the lessons children receive in the Mass on Sunday.

### And what are the 5 marks of a Catholic Education?

The Church's vision of education has been articulated through a variety of magisterial documents. "The Holy See's Teaching on Catholic Schools", by Archbishop J. Michael Miller (2006), former Secretary of the Sacred Congregation for Catholic Education, faithfully summarizes the last fifty years of Magisterial documents on the Catholic school.

- 2. Founded on a Christian Anthropology
- 3. Animated by Communion and Community
- 4. Imbued with a Catholic Worldview throughout its Curriculum
- 5. Sustained by Gospel Witness
