PICKING UP YOUR CHILD?

Parents & Guardians, please remember that if you are picking up your child during school hours, you <u>MUST ring the front door doorbell</u>, let the office staff know who you are picking up and the office staff will call your child down to the office. The student will be walked to the front door, at which time the parents/guardians may come into the vestibule and sign their child out in the sign-out book. If your child normally takes the bus home and you decide to pick them up, pleased ensure that you <u>let the bus driver or their bus supervisor know</u> that the student will not be taking the bus. This is so we may mark them off our list and that the bus does not wait for a student that has already gone home.

Kindergarten & Grade 1 Students

For safety reasons can only ride the bus when their names appear on the Detail report. They must be met by an adult, or they shall be returned to their school where they can be picked up.

When to catch my bus?

Please be out 5 minutes prior to your scheduled pick-up time.

What to do if my bus does not arrive?

Please wait 10 minutes after your pick-up / drop off time. If the bus has not arrived, please call the Transportation Department.

Bus Notifications

If the Transportation office is advised that a bus is running late, a notification will go out on the <u>Bus Planner Delay app, which we try to keep updated in real time.</u>

Route Change Dates (Regular Yellow & Curb Service)

Changes only occur on Wednesdays. Changes take 4 - 6 weeks starting August 31st and then each Wednesday after.

How will I be notified about transportation changes?

An automated email will go out on a Friday night around 6:00 pm regarding possible changes to your child's bus route. Go to your parent portal to see your child's transportation information showing the effective date.

NEW THIS YEAR FOR TRANSPORTATION

For the 2022-2023 school year, the Transportation Department will be implementing ZONAR ZPass bus passes and scanners for each regular route. This will aid the Transportation Department in payment of fees and let them know if a student has boarded or not boarded the school bus, as they must scan their bus pass as they get on and off the bus. There will be a one-time scanner bus pass with the option to pay for the bus monthly or annually. Bus passes will still be \$36.75 per month or \$367.50 annually. (Family Plan will be \$32.00 per month. For Family Plan pricing you must have 3 or more students in any ECSD school who take the bus). Please ensure that each monthly bus fee is paid as the bus scanners will be deactivated and the student may not be allowed to ride the bus.

MEDICAL ALERTS

When a student has a life-threatening (anaphylactic) allergy or other medical condition such as epilepsy, allergy to insects, peanuts and /or other food, other allergens etc., the parent shall provide at enrollment, and thereafter at the beginning of the school year, with a completed Request for Administration of Medication/Medical Treatment Form (pages 1-4). The only non-prescription drugs that may be administered to a student are those supplied by the student's parent. Parental requests for administration of parent-supplied non-prescription drugs such as acetaminophen (e.g., aspirins), cold remedies and inhalants are not to be granted without the written permission of the parents. A physician signature is not required for administration of non-prescription medication. We request that parents complete the Request for Administration of Medication/Medical Treatment (pages 1-4) for all students requiring administration of non-prescription medication. These forms can be found on the St. Teresa School website under School Information.

READ IN WEEK October 3rd-7th



The READ IN Week initiative began in the 1990's and consisted of representatives from Edmonton Catholic Schools, Edmonton Public Schools and Norquest (then) AVC. These organizations decided to join together to raise awareness for the importance of literacy. It was determined that the significance of literacy must begin with young children Kindergarten - Grade 12 and carry on to adults in the form of life-long learning. Various partners have been involved in READ IN Week, from schools including the Francophone district to post-secondary institutions, the City of Edmonton and various media outlets. The focus of this initiative has been to instill the love of reading in all Edmontonians.

Let Your Light Shine Forth

I will bless the Lord at all times. Praise shall always be on my lips; my soul shall glory in the Lord; for God has been so good to me. (Taste and See, James E. Moore)

Every year when Thanksgiving comes around, my mind brings me back to this hymn. It speaks the fundamental truth that God is good and abundant in his love. If we pay attention, we can taste, and see, and feel, and hear the goodness of the Lord around us everyday. It reminds me to live in gratitude.

We also celebrate the Feast of Our Lady of Schools on the third Sunday of October. Each of our Grade 5 students receives a bookmark with a prayer to Our Lady of Schools as part of their religion program. Our Lady of Schools is a devotion to Mary started in 1894 in France by a priest who introduced it in his local schools with the approval of Pope Leo XIII. In 1947, Pope Pius XII proclaimed Our Lady of Schools as the patron saint of schools and of students in the province of Quebec, and in 1952, he extended this by declaring her the patron saint of all schools and students in Canada.

We will be hosting an Open House at our new Lumen Christi Catholic Education Centre, 9405 50 Street NW on October 15 from 10:00 a.m. – 2:00 p.m. There will be a brief program at 10:30 a.m. that will repeat at 12:30 p.m. You are invited to come see our new common home.

On October 24, our Board of Trustees will be holding a Community of School Councils event at our new Lumen Christi Catholic Education Centre. The evening will run from 7:00 – 8:30 p.m. and registration is required. Members of School Councils are invited to attend and share their opinions with the Board as they prepare to set new priorities for the next 3-year planning cycle. Contact your principal for registration information.

As part of the <u>Government of Alberta's K-6 curriculum renewal</u>, Kindergarten to Grade 6 students are learning a new provincial curriculum in English Language Arts and Literature (K-3), Mathematics (K-3), and Physical Education and Wellness (K-6). Some ECSD classrooms are also taking part in piloting a draft curriculum in Science (K-6) and French Immersion Language Arts and Literature (K-3). Our Division has been preparing for implementation since the new curriculum was released in the Spring. Our priority is ensuring student success and supporting our teachers during implementation. Professional development for ECSD teachers will continue all year. Our Learning Services team hosted a livestream last month to unpack the new curriculum which can be viewed on our website at ecsd.net/curriculum.

I will leave you with a tweet from Pope Francis on September 15. He shared, "Grateful hearts overflowing with praise harbour no regrets, but welcome each day as a grace."

The Impact of Giving Thanks¹

The Gospel reading for Thanksgiving Sunday highlights the impact of our thanksgiving. Jesus encounters ten lepers who ask to be healed. He tells them, "Go show yourselves to the priests."

In Jesus' time, leprosy was treated as a spiritual condition, because there was no medical way to treat it, so a priest would determine if someone had been cured of leprosy or not.

The ten heed Jesus' instruction and head off to see the priests. While on their way, they discover that they are healed. Of the ten, only one, a Samaritan, turns back and thanks Jesus for the healing; the other nine do not.

Jesus responds, somewhat hurt: "Ten were cleansed, were they not? Where are the other nine?"

When I imagine myself in Jesus' place, his reaction is like my own. We want to be thanked for *all* the work that we do, not just some of it. However, I think this Gospel story has a deeper message to teach us.

Imagine for a moment that you are Jesus. Replay the same scene of healing in your mind, but this time when you heal the ten, no one turns back. How do you feel?

The difference between being thanked by only one person and no one at all is enormous. Jesus continues to heal, not for the gratitude of the many, but because of the profoundly grateful few.

The experience of Jesus reminds us that the impact of our thanksgiving is greater than ourselves. Our words speak on behalf of all those who have received and create the future opportunity for others to receive also.

As we celebrate Thanksgiving, let us joyfully give thanks and rejoice that we are creating a better future for others.
